



# AFC Virtual School 2024 KS4 Results

EBacc Entry: Whole school (OC2): 7.7% (2023: 12% & 2022 31%). National CLA 2023: 10.8%. National all pupils 2023: 39.3%

Stability in Key Stage Four for non-dis-applied: Richmond - 0/5 had a move, Kingston - 0/5 had moves & RBWM - 0/3 had a move.

SEN: Across the whole Year 11 cohort, 63% had SEND (EHCP: 52% % SEN support (K) 11%). Nationally, 30% of CLA had an EHCP in 2023. This is important for context when comparing to all pupils nationally (3.9%).

Overall, our results in all of the key areas are above the national averages for Children Looked After (CLA), and have increased significantly since last year. Of the 13 OC2 students who were not dis-applied, 6 students (46%) met the expected standard in Key Stage Two. There was an increase in Attainment 8 across the school and in all three areas. In addition, there was a massive increase (53.8%) in pupils achieving Grade 4 in English and Maths when compared to 2023 (18%). However, there is a trend of underperformance in terms of students attaining English and Maths at Grade 5. Although this is above (23.1%) the national average for looked after peers (9.5%), it is well below parity with non-looked after peers (45.3%). Crucially, students without an EHCP (A8 = 37.4) only performed marginally better than whose with an EHCP (35.2). Moving forwards, we will be focussing on improving outcomes in English and Maths. This includes placing all of our children in 'Good' & 'Outstanding' schools, advocating against school moves (particularly at Key Stage Four) and utilising interventions to overcome barriers to learning: outreach learning support, educational psychologist consultations, one-to-one tuition and online learning platforms such as Sam Learning. These processes start in primary school in order to achieve positive outcomes at the end of secondary education (Year 11).
