Welcome to AfC Virtual School's 2023 Summer Activities Brochure.

Please join us for a fun-filled week of complimentary activities for our children and young people in care and previously looked after children who are registered in any of our three cohorts: Kingston, Richmond, and Windsor and Maidenhead boroughs.

All activities will take place in person, and we are super excited to see as many of you as possible, after such a long time.

Please can we ask all children to bring plenty of water, lunch and snacks with them each day *apart from the Smart Raspberry Cookery School sessions. Please can we ask you to be mindful of allergies, please do not provide any nut based items in packed lunches.

More detail is provided beside each activity throughout the brochure, as there are some specific requirements depending on which activity you are participating in.

For any outdoor activities, please also ensure the children have applied sunscreen before they arrive, and have brought some along with them in their bags, should they need to re-apply during the day - also provide a sun hat if the weather is good!

RICHMOND and KINGSTON

Monday 24 July

Albany Outdoors multi-activity adventure and water activity fun day (8+ years must be confident in water)

All carers and parents must complete an albanys outdoors declaration and medical consent form for each child, which is to be completed in full prior to the activity. Failure to complete this may mean participants cannot take part - the online link for this will be issued by AfC Virtual School upon registration.

Please wear comfortable clothes and trainers, dress according to the weather, nothing new.

Also bring a full change of clothes and spare shoes, a water bottle which can be refilled on site, as well as a packed lunch and snacks. If the weather is hot, bring a hat and sun lotion.

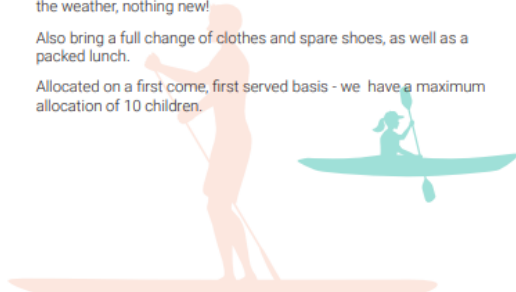
Come and join us at Taplow Lake and take part in some fun activities on the water, these will include kayaking on the Jubilee River and stand up paddleboarding on the lake.

Additionally, these activities provided an opportunity for our young people to meet and develop positive friendships and interactions with like-minded children, who they may not normally have the opportunity to meet otherwise. 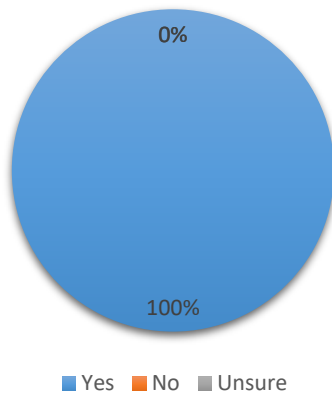
- Arts Participation

EVENT SUMMARY

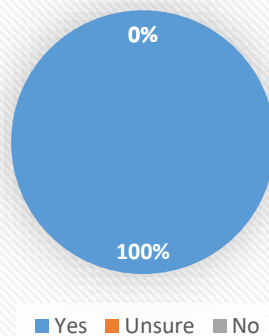
- Our Richmond, Kingston and RBWM summer activities had an overall attendance of 66 young people in total.
- 100% of young people enjoyed the activities they took part in.
- 100% of young people would like to attend similar activities in person, in future.
- All of the activities proved extremely popular with the children, specifically so as they were based outdoors, which the children loved.
- This information suggests our young people are most interested in in person outdoor group activities, where they are working as a team and learning together.
- Fun activities like the Watersports, Legoland Workshops/Rides, Pottery and Cookery Workshops were ranked the most popular.

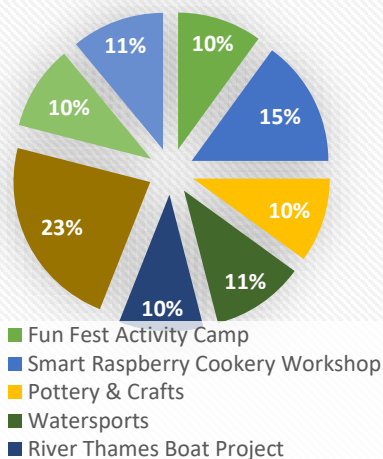
My child enjoyed the Summer Activities Week.

Just to say thank you to you and your colleagues for the activities that were provided last week, I know you must have all been exhausted by the end of the week... I found it particularly useful as there was time for Pupil X to be involved with us and join in when she did the shorter days. She also enjoyed herself too. Many thanks again.

Thank you so much for the wonderful opportunities on offer for a 10 year old. There was a real variety. I think it's so important for children in care to have the chance to connect with other children who share some of their life experiences. A has been in care for 5 years but had never been to so many activities in a week. She said it's been the best start to the holidays, something different each day and I feel so much calmer.

As a carer the scheme has been really fab and we are very grateful for the enrichment opportunities she has had with you. Thank you! I think it's fantastic, we really valued you.

Just wanted to say Pupil X has had the MOST amazing week - made friends with other adopted children (one particularly she has bonded with – Pupil Y) and generally had a fab time - thank you so much to you and your team for all your hard work. Thank again for an amazing week.

Thank you for the Virtual school activities. Pupil X really enjoyed all the activities. Her favourite was the cookery club. Pupil X enjoyed all the activities on all the days.

Thanks again for a lovely week. It really gives me a break too. Pupil X, aged 12 really loved the cooking and the pottery. Pottery was his favourite, he would love to do the pottery again.

I think the best thing is the variety of activities to get involved with. It was great for him to try lots of different things so he could explore avenues of interest and help him form an idea of what he most enjoys doing.

The specific activity he enjoyed the most was the boat cruise. It was really a unique experience that would rarely happen and he spoke enthusiastically about so many different parts of it – especially driving the boat! From a practical perspective as a parent, it is difficult to organise something like that that includes crafts, driving the boat, having a professional answer all his questions about how it works etc. Whilst he also really loved the pottery/crafts, cooking class, and Fun Fest (the quality of all of them was top notch), I wouldn't know where to start with recreating the same experience as the boat cruise, there were so many different facets to it!

To be honest, what you organised was perfect!

The best part for Pupil X is making friends – friends who he would love to see at future events.

Pottery painting was a big hit – and having the souvenir to keep is something he has never had before. Legoland, the chance to go with new friends was awesome! Fun Fest, he would definitely go again – he was so busy on the day he didn't have "time" to eat his lunch!

Pupil X enjoyed the variety. Always enjoys cooking. Seemed to enjoy modelling. He even enjoyed the library day which he wasn't naturally looking forward to! Was great to have really good staff and workshop leads with specialities involved. Felt like a real treat for him, e.g. my children couldn't go...
